THE SPCO CONNECT PROGRAM: Through the curriculum-based CONNECT (Chamber Orchestra's Neighborhood Network of Education, Curriculum, and Teachers) program, the SPCO provides enriching music education free-of-charge to a diverse population of 5,000 students in 12 Saint Paul and Minneapolis public elementary schools, as well as 250 local homeschool students, annually. The program includes curriculum for classrooms, school visits by SPCO musicians, and a culminating full-orchestra concert in the spring exclusively produced for CONNECT participants. Students from Greater Twin Cities Youth Symphonies (GTCYS) will perform for each school to further inspire and make connections with CONNECT students. All CONNECT lesson plans and teaching materials are tied directly to state Department of Education standards in reading, math, history, and more. In addition to the classroom activities, materials, resources, and CONNECT concert, which are free to all participating schools, the SPCO offers complimentary and \$5 tickets to CONNECT school students, families, teachers, and staff for regular SPCO concerts throughout the season. We also promote our Target Free Family Music to the students, providing an additional free venue for them to expand upon their musical knowledge. The distance pilot of this program would provide this access through video conferencing, streaming materials and would broaden the reach of our supplementary music education program to students beyond the Twin Cities Metro area.

CONNECT PROGRAM COMMITMENTS AND RESPONSIBILTIES:

The Saint Paul Chamber Orchestra will:

- o Annually provide each student in 1st-5th grade with:
 - A CONNECT student newsletter
 - One recorded CONNECT concert by The Saint Paul Chamber Orchestra
 - A video-conferenced school concert preparation visit by an SPCO musician
- Annually provide each educator with:
 - One teacher supplement to accompany and guide the use of the CONNECT
 - Access to classroom resources to enhance the CONNECT curriculum, such as books and CDs as well as a consultation from a music specialist.
 - CONNECT concert preparation and follow-up materials
- Ensure that full participation in the CONNECT program remains completely free of charge to partnering schools
- Work with partnering schools on the continued integration, development and evaluation of all CONNECT program components.
- o Communicate clearly and be readily available to partnering schools

CONNECT Music teacher Liaisons are expected to:

- Foster a school-wide sense of pride for the CONNECT program and encourage active participation in all program activities
- Serve as the contact between the school and the SPCO- being responsive by email and phone
- Coordinate the distribution and use of all provided CONNECT materials and resources
- o Coordinate and relay all communication for any video-conferenced visits
- o Deliver the CONNECT curriculum elements to students in grades 1-5
- Complete a program evaluation at the end of the year
- Coordinate implementation dates for each of the curriculum elements and any videoconferenced school visits for students
