### 2021.22 SEASON **NEIGHBORHOOD SERIES**

After resuming concerts at the Ordway Concert Hall this fall, we are so pleased to announce the return of our Neighborhood Series performances beginning in January 2022. We are thrilled to welcome you back to our Neighborhood Series venues across the metro area with a lineup of concerts curated and led by our own SPCO musicians. We will continue to prioritize health and safety and have planned a number of measures designed to provide the safest possible concert experience as we come together again to enjoy live music.

Proof of COVID-19 vaccination or a negative COVID-19 test taken within 72 hours prior to a concert will be required in order to attend, and attendance will be limited to allow for distancing. Masks will be required for all audience members and concerts will be shortened to 60-75 minutes in length with no intermission to prevent crowds from gathering in restrooms and lobbies. These protocols will be subject to change based on the course of the pandemic in our community and ticket holders will be notified of current safety protocols via email prior to each concert. Our musicians have planned a series of concerts that reflect their musical passions, taking great care in curating each program so that every concert takes audiences on a stimulating musical journey. Highlights of our Neighborhood Series performances include a new bespoke arrangement of Johann Sebastian Bach's Goldberg Variations for the SPCO by our Principal Horn James Ferree, a new orchestration of Sergei Prokofiev's Violin Sonata in F by Stephen Prutsman performed by Concertmaster Steven Copes, and solo performances by SPCO musicians, including Maureen Nelson, Alicia McQuerrey Cassie Pilgrim and Julia Bogorad-Kogan.

Since the beginning of this pandemic, our audience and our community have rallied around the SPCO with amazing support. Thank you so much for being there for us and for helping us continue to share the connecting power of music during this challenging time. Our commitment to sharing performances by our incredible orchestra with everyone in our community remains as strong as ever, and we look to the future with optimism and hope. 




#### COMMITMENT TO SAFETY
